The regular meeting of the Franklin Town Council was held on Monday March 4, 2019 at 6 p.m. in the Town Hall Board Room. Mayor Robert S. Scott presided. Vice Mayor Barbara McRae and council Members Joe Collins, Adam Kimsey, Dinah Mashburn and Brandon McMahan were present.

Council Member David Culpepper was absent

Motion was made by McRae, seconded by McMahan to excuse Culpepper from the meeting. Motion carried. Vote: 5 to 0.

New Business: Street Closing Request for Springtopia II

Bill Krepak and Jimbo Ledford presented this item.

Council Member Mashburn – I think that permitting the closing of this street on a weekday sets a bad precedent.

Motion was made by Kimsey, seconded by McRae to grant street closing request for Springtopia II. Motion carried. Vote: 4 to 1. Mashburn opposed.

New Business: Guardrail Request for South Patton Avenue

Jimbo Ledford – There have been multiple wrecks involving vehicles backing out of Frogtown and going off the bank towards the area setup for restrooms on my property.

Mayor Scott – Chief Adams, were there any contributing factors to these accidents?

Police Chief David Adams – No, there were not.

Public Works Director Nathanael Moore told the board that the cost for a guardrail would be around \$16,000.

Motion was made by Mashburn, seconded by McRae to look at potentially adding a guardrail on South Patton Avenue after more information is gathered. Motion carried. Vote: 5 to 0.

New Business: Discussion on Town of Franklin Employee Retirement Appreciation

Town Manager Summer Woodard presented this item.

Motion was made by Collins, seconded by Mashburn to approve amendments to the personnel policy. Motion carried. Vote: 5 to 0. Amendment is attached.

New Business: Update on NCDOT Main Street Project

Public Works Director Nathanael Moore presented this item.

Mayor Scott told the Town Council that he would like to ask the county for help funding the crosswalks set to be installed.

Council Member McMahan - I don't have an issue asking for some help. I don't think it would hurt.

Council Member Collins – I feel like this is a project that we could handle ourselves.

Town Council decided to refrain from asking county for funds.

New Business: Update from Franklin Fire & Rescue Department

Fire Chief Matthew Breedlove informed the Council that the Town would like to rent a space to temporarily place a fire truck in an extended region of the Franklin Fire District in order to help home owners in the district lower their fire rating for insurance purposes.

Motion was made by McMahan, seconded by Mashburn to allow Chief Breedlove and Town Administration to pursue a lease agreement for a location to store a fire truck in the far reaches of the Franklin Fire District. Motion carried. Vote: 5 to 0.

Legal: Duke Energy Line Crossing Agreement

Town Attorney John Henning Jr. presented this item.

Motion was made by Collins, seconded by McRae to approve the agreement between the Town and Duke Energy. Motion carried. Vote: 5 to 0.
